II. Project Summary [Not exceed 1000 words]	<p>In response to the devastating earthquakes in April and May 2015, CSRC in collaboration with FDF implemented an earthquake recovery project from June 2015 to September 2016 (the project was extended for 3 months from July to September 2016). The project consisted of two main components: construction of 2 temporary community shelters and 2 permanent community centres to provide support for the community an emergency shelter during a disaster and to strengthen community ties; and livelihood support to assist the beneficiaries' self-recovery efforts through achieving sustainable livelihoods.</p> <p>Due to the above mentioned changed contexts, the first activity of constructing 2 temporary community emergency shelters was cancelled. After the monsoon, the construction of 2 permanent community centres was commenced, and one was completed in Halde village of Helambu in July 2016 (it was handed over to the community in May 2016 so that they could utilise it while the remaining finishing work was being carried out). The community centre in another community, Nurbuling Community Kharkadanda village in Kiul VDC before and now ward two of Helambu Rural Municipality, was completed. Under livelihood component the project supported to 100 households (HHs) with a grant of Rs 15,000 each to assist their livelihood options.</p>

	This additional project design for making gabion wall and kitchen in ward number 2 at Nurbuling of Helambu Rural Municipality where already constructed the community building. The phase two was also accomplished successfully. This third phase is designed to enhance the livelihood status of the poor people who are now preparing to stay an integrated settlements and also for piloting the land use plan in two wards of Helambu Rural Municipality of Sindhupalchok.
