Project Summary [Not exceed 1000 words]	This project is designed for furthering the ongoing GLTN country-level engagement in selected municipalities in Nepal aligning with the GLTN strategic Plan 2018-2030, UNDAF 2018-2022 and the UN Socio-Economic Recovery Framework for Nepal, and supporting an up-scale FFP approach for tenure security. The major objective of this project is to "Support to upscale Fit-For-Purpose Land Administration Country Strategy Implementation, Policy Support and Capacity Development". In, this perspective the project will mainly focus on three Output areas: 1. Carryout Study on Tenancy Rights and Unregistered Tenancy, Land Governance and, Climate Change Issue in the Country Context. 2. Support to Scale up of FFPLA tools implementation and Land Information System and, 3. Engaged Dialogue on Land Issues especially on Policy, Acts and FFPLA.		
	The result of this project will support the National Land Commission (NLC) and Local Governments in resolving the issues of informal land tenure and landless in the current that COVID-19 has made the poor people, especially those living in the informal settlements even more vulnerable to livelihoods, food security, shelter, and income. It will support advocacy and developing knowledge of provincial and local government authorities in order to support the NLC efforts for tenure security and livelihood improvement of landless, slum dwellers and marginalized tenure holders including implementing land policy in favor of landless and land poor communities.

Expected Results (With indicators)	Outcome /Result:	 Study on land and climate change nexus on land tenure, tenancy, land use and impacts to the landless and squatters, Publication on the informal tenancy of landless and marginal landholders Publication on localization of land governance. Continue strategic engagement with NLC and the Local Governments in the currently ongoing 14 municipalities through support to the local facilitation committee for participatory enumeration, data entry, data analysis and data verification and approval process. Technical support in the application of FFPLA tools in the land mapping process is extended. Promotion of tenure-responsive and risk-sensitive land use planning tools and processes will be extended to address issues of land arrangement and land use planning. Leaning workshops among key representatives of local governments, national governments and agencies working on the land sector are conducted. At least 14 Land Right Forums and 2 Cooperatives will be engaged to empower the landless, informal settlers, tenants, and sharecroppers and enable participation in NLC efforts for tenure security.
