
THE DIAGNOSTIC LAND STUDY REPORT SUBMITTED TO MOLMCPA AND NLC

A comprehensive diagnostic study had been conducted to know the ground situation of Landless Dalits, Landless Squatters, and Informal settlers and the implementation status of the IVR process as per the guidelines and policies of the National Land Commission (NLC). During the study 20 focus group discussion and KII was made with the 12 local, district, provincial and federal level government representatives, CSOs and the communities. The report has been prepared in collaboration with Habitat for Humanity Nepal, Landesa and Community Self-Reliance Service Centre analysing the different reports and evidence from the policy review, field findings, case stories, data, and key information of KII.

The comprehensive study report had been prepared focusing the bottlenecks of current work of NLC with specific recommendations. On 5 June, 2023, the team submitted the report to Hon. Minister for Land Management, Cooperatives and Poverty Alleviation (MoLMCPA) Ranjita Shrestha Chaudhary and Chairperson of the National Land Commission Keshab Niraula separately. The legal Officer of MoLMCPA is reviewing the report and NLC has owned the study report fully.
